WHAT IS THE IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME



The IB DP is an academically challenging and balanced programme of education, with final examinations, that prepares students aged 16-19 for success at university and in life beyond.



It has been designed to address the **intellectual**, **social**, **emotional** and **phys ical** well-being of students.



It supports the development of the attributes of the **IB learner profile**, promotes **effective teamwork** and **purposeful collaboration**, emphasises **learning how to learn** (ATLs) and promotes the **autonomy of the learner**.

We are starting in September 2023 with 1 class (10-25 students)

Teaching in English language

6 subjects from 6 groups = $3 \times SL + 3 \times HL + The Core (Jadro)$

SL (standard level) = 4 lessons per week

HL (higher level) = 6 lessons per week

Award of the IB Diploma at the end of the study

THE IB CORE

EE – The extended essay – it is a requirement for students to engage in independent research through an indepth study of a question relating to some of the subjects they are studying (4000 words, guidance of a supervisor).

TOK – Theory of knowledge – is a course designed to encourage each student to reflect on the nature of knowledge. The school provides at least 100 teaching hours for TOK.

CAS – Creativity, activity, service – requires that the students actively learn from their experience of doing real tasks beyond the classroom.

HOW TO GET THE DIPLOMA



Subject grade in the IB Diploma is a result of both **internal** and **external assessment**. Internally assessed work counts for 20-30 % of the final grade.



The award of **the diploma** requires a minimum total of 24 points and satisfactory completion of TOK, CAS and Extended Essay. The maximum score of the six subjects is 42. TOK and Extended Essay may contribute up to three points, so the **maximum Diploma point score is 45**.

A2.2.1 Core requirements

- DP category candidates must study six subjects, plus the three core subjects—EE, TOK and CAS. They
 must accumulate no fewer than 24 points from assessment in these subjects, in addition to grade
 stipulations.
- They must meet all of the additional requirements—see section "A2.2.2".
- They must meet all of the requirements within a maximum of three examination sessions.
- Candidates who successfully meet these conditions will be awarded the diploma.
- Candidates who take the diploma in multiple languages may be eligible for a bilingual diploma.

The IB diploma is awarded based on performance across all parts of the DP.

- Each subject is graded 1–7, with 7 being the highest grade.
- These grades are also used as points (that is, 7 points for a grade 7, 6 points for a grade 6, and so on) in determining if the diploma can be awarded.
- TOK and the EE are graded A–E, with A being the highest grade. These two grades are then combined in the diploma points matrix to contribute between 0 and 3 points to the total.
- CAS is not assessed but must be completed in order to pass the diploma. See section "A2.2.2".
- The overall maximum points from subject grades, TOK and the EE is therefore 45: $((6 \times 7) + 3)$.
- The minimum threshold for the award of the diploma is 24 points. If a candidate scores less than 24

Changes from The diploma points matrix (May 2010 - November 2014):

- B + C combination now results in 2 additional points (previously 1 point).
- A + E combination now results in zero points and a failing condition (previously 1 point).



A2.2.2 Additional requirements

There are a number of additional requirements for the award of the diploma.

- CAS requirements have been met.
- There is no "N" awarded for TOK, the EE or for a contributing subject.
- There is no grade E awarded for TOK and/or the EE.
- There is no grade 1 awarded in a subject/level.
- There are no more than two grade 2s awarded (SL or HL).
- There are no more than three grade 3s or below awarded (SL or HL).
- The candidate has gained 12 points or more on HL subjects. (For candidates who register for four HL subjects, the three highest grades count.)
- The candidate has gained 9 points or more on SL subjects. (Candidates who register for two SL subjects must gain at least 5 points at SL.)
- The candidate has not received a penalty for academic misconduct from the Final Award Committee.
